## **SANCTIFICATION**

Our current sermon series is entitled, "The Wilderness Sanctuary." The fundamental lessons deal with the process of sanctification ... as does the book we distributed last Sabbath. If you haven't received a copy of Dare to be a Daniel, by Dr. Philip Samaan, please see me after worship as there should be a book for each family.

Sanctification is one of the most frequent, important, and all-embracing concepts in Scripture. It has to do with God and man; with relationships, worship, and morals; with every period of our lives; and with every element of the world ~ including times and places, objects and rituals. It is so significant that believers are admonished to strive "*for the holiness without which no one will see the Lord.*" (Heb 12:14) In the Hebrew Old Testament, the term is found as a verb which literally means "to set apart" or "make holy" approximately 170 times. It shows as a noun about 470 times and as an adjective about 120 times. In the Greek New Testament the concept appears 28 times as a verb, 10 times as a noun, and 233 times as an adjective. With this degree of frequency, seems obvious that the Holy Spirit considered the concept significant.

Sanctification describes a new relationship or status. The basic meaning of the concept is to be set apart or separated as illustrated by the 7<sup>th</sup> day of Creation where God set it apart or sanctified it to be His special day. (Gen 2:3 & Exodus 20:8 – 11) The relationship basis of sanctification is found in 1 Corth 1:2. As a result of God's call, the Corinthians already had been sanctified or set apart as His people ... it's a relationship with God, not a description of a moral standing. So, sanctification refers to God's setting a part of a people to belong to Him and to serve Him ... but this *isn't* the whole story.

Sanctification also describes our moral growth in goodness. According to 1 John 3:2, we as believers are children of God; but, we do not know what we shall be ~ but we know that when Christ appears we shall be like Him ... or ... we won't be with Him! Until that time we undergo a process of purification with Christ being the standard of purity (see 1 John 3:3). What takes place from the time of being set apart for Christ to the time when we shall be like Christ is also known as sanctification: the gradual, progressive process of moral change. We have to choose to allow our human spirit to cooperate with the Holy Spirit. He has the power to make the necessary change ... once we grant Him permission.

One of the most important passages in Scripture for sanctification as moral change is Romans Chpt 6. Here, Paul affirms that the Christian who has died to sin as the lord of their life, no longer lives under its domination (Vs 2 & 14). With the crucifixion of the old self, sin's power over us and the necessity to serve sin have been broken (V 6). Because of our new state of union with Christ, sin has lost its authority over us and living for God's glory is our new reality. ***There is much to praise God ... His mercy is afresh each day***
